PHOTO HINTS

With the hot weather just around the corner I thought that a few tips on camera care might not go amiss.

Heat and damp are the two most damaging conditions for your camera and film. Film in the camera, in the unopened box - or after exposure can all be damaged by heat. It plays funny tricks with the colours and can even melt and cause a blurred image.

Prevention is easy... store in a cool place out of the sun...not in the boot or glove box where the temperature can get very high. In a foam lunch box, covered up out of the sun is ideal.

Most of us seem to be using Zoom lenses now, very convenient, if a bit bulky. All lenses can be effected by heat. The cement between the glass elements can be ruined by heat and the lens made useless. The point about Zoom lenses is that they have more elements than plain lenses and therefore more cemented joints. The outer barrels are usually black and can pick up the heat very quickly. Especially if left in the sun. Cameras have the same problem, and they will transmit the heat to the film in them just as quickly if left in the sun. A little care is all that is needed....

1. Store camera gear/film etc. in a cool place.
2. Do not leave your camera etc. exposed to the sun, either in direct sun, or worse, behind glass.

Damp is more of a problem.

In the tropics during the wet season the humidity is a boon to fungi. It grows like wildfire. It can grow inside your camera. A \$500.00 camera can be converted into a very effective sinker in not time!

Fungus will grow inside your lenses too and so spare lenses should be looked after stored in dry, airy conditions. Damp can be a problem anywhere of course, remember those steamed up car windows last winter

When you buy a lens it comes with a small sachet of silica gel. This is to absorb moisture and prevent this kind of damage. A small cloth bag of rice in with your gear will also do this. It should be popped into the oven now and again to dry out.
