

Seniors, Ladies and Juniors will cast accuracy first, Veterans will cast distance first.



Leaders:-

The wet weather is here, the Yokine Reserve surface is now soft, and those casting weights bury themselves in the grass. Competition Rules section **3.3.4 Leaders** says "A heavy leader is compulsory for all events."

"Heavy" means **strong enough** to let the markers pull the weight out of the ground in the opposite direction by steadily pulling on the leader without it snapping off, perhaps just by loosening the ground a bit, but without having to dig out the weight right out. Please use leaders of at least 25 kg breaking strain and preferably heavier. The markers will thank you, and so will the queue of people waiting to have their casts, and your weight and leader won't be damaged by the digging.

S Bend Field Day - June 2011

Looking at weather forecasts, past experience of Surfcasters and reports in recent newspapers, our Club anglers headed off to S Bend, filled with anticipation of some great fishing to be encountered. Most left Perth on Friday to set up camp and be settled in by that night, with only a few arriving on Saturday morning.

A total of twelve Surfcasters attended the sign on at S Bend, with a total of five signing on for the Perth local fishing venue; hence seventeen participated in this Club event.

A few of us (Peet and Sandra Wessels and I) drove up to S Bend on Friday morning, had a look around on Friday afternoon and evening and Saturday morning at popular spots. My wife Sharon was assisting at my daughter's Horse Riding School on Friday and drove up on Saturday morning.

On driving around it quickly became evident that seaweed was going to be the problem for this weekend. We found patches of clear water at Lucy's and some minor weed at Duncan's. The water looked good, but this exploration and wetting a line at both of these spots revealed no fish at these locations.

Come Saturday late morning and after the sign on and full of expectation, the various fisherpersons headed off to their favourite spots. Sharon and I headed to Lucy's as this was the cleanest water. The Wessels joined us but only one Dart caught between us. However another angler caught a tailor which raised our expectation. Fishing into the dark, nothing happened at the prime fishing time

We returned there on Sunday morning and evening, but slow. I managed only one tailor at each of these sessions with other Surfcasters getting nought, however a couple of Offshore fisherpersons managed to bag a tailor. Also had my arms stretched on large rays. Boy it's hard work to get a metre plus wide ray up on the beach, only to let it go.

John Crompton, Ray Walker and crew hit Nine Mile where they fished hard all day for nil result. Sunday was also plagued with rain nearly all day but generally not heavy.

The Wessels tried up at Greenough River mouth area, found plenty of tailor, pike, and whiting but nearly all well and truly undersize. Only a couple of whiting scraped into being size for the weigh-in, with Sandra adding a wrasse to her one whiting. The Pekaars had rented a cabin at the Greenough River caravan park. They met up and swapped notes, where the Pekaars also found these undersize fish with Peter persevering and coming up with one size tailor at the river mouth.

The following morning I decided on a venue at Lucy's again as was at least catching one fish each on the previous sessions. Wrong choice, and not enough time to relocate. I was the only Surfcaster there, and with weed moving in shortly after start of fishing, and despite moving down the beach to slightly cleaner water, a nil result ensued. However there was plenty of exercise pulling in lumps of weed. All of us, no matter where we fished, were very proficient at this activity by the end of the weekend.

Congratulations must go to Justin Rose for a respectable bag, his heaviest fish being a 1.7 kg gilled and gutted Tailor. Justin also had the heaviest bag comprising five tailor and two dart, for a total of 5.4kg. He caught a couple of fish at Lucy's but found fish on Monday morning on the beach driving well south of Flat Rock.

The beach consistently has very soft sand – I got bogged there last year. He reported some weed but looking for gutters with reasonably clear waters which generally yielded fish. He dropped a few tailor and unfortunately lost a large mulloway. It appears to be the only place that fired for this weekend.

Weigh-in on Monday morning was one of the quickest ever, course this was due to the lack of fish across the scales.

Talking with other another club (Offshore) they did not do very well and also had a few fishermen with nil results, but one of their members was delighted to catch a 6 kg mulloway at Duncan's.

As always a number of keen fishermen from Perth or even further south tow up trailers loaded with quad bikes. They searched various out of the way places not accessible by 4WD but only found weed.

But to cap the field day off, on return, discussion with some of the local field day fisherpersons gave that they also had the same problem in finding fish. While we had some wind, wave action and swell at S Bend, local Perth waters were like a millpond at prime fishing times. Three of the five participants caught up to three fish.

Pat McKeown went searching for a garfish at various locations to complete his species badge but came up empty handed. George Holman managed a couple of good skippy at Floreat. Nick Edwards and Wayne Shaw tried the Swan River and caught some quality black bream. Wayne caught the only herring for the weekend. Allan Jones put in his usual effort at Floreat but no reward. It will be difficult for him to duplicate that snapper catch at Floreat.

For this field day, it was a less than desirable result with respect to quantity and quality of fish caught by nearly all of us; hence it does make us appreciate these field days that fire. But fishing is like that – prime spots fire, then a few days later it bombs out. Made me appreciate the recent field days down south and Rottnest.

Recfishwest report

South west marine plans and proposals.

Western Angler magazine Editor, Scott Coghlan and several other concerned individuals and fishing businesses have set up a website in order to make it easy for individual fishers to submit their views directly to the Minister involved in making the decisions on Commonwealth Marine Reserves.

The Recreational Lifestyle Alliance website www.rla.net.au has a pro-forma response which, after the inclusion of the senders' details, is emailed directly to the Federal Environment Minister, Tony Burke. The website also contains a page of extra suggestions should you wish to write your own submission that differs from that of the standard response.

It is important that recreational fishers formally acknowledge that recreational fishing is recognised in the draft plan and that the Federal Government should not be swayed by the powerful green lobby which will be fighting for further no-take sanctuary zones, particularly in the proposed Perth Canyon (Rottnest Trench). Please take five minutes out of your day to have your say on Commonwealth Marine Reserves. It could have a great impact on recreational fishing's future.

Presentation from Fisheries on proposed standardisation and simplification of fishing rules.

Recfishwest staff and some Board members attended a briefing on 14 June. The presentation covered the possible approaches to deal with the current complex, confusing and compromise rules which vary between the four Bioregions:- South and West Coast, Gascoyne and Pilbara/Kimberley.

This covered possession limits, changes to unaccompanied consignment of fish, changes to the species groupings, categories and descriptions, category daily bag limits, the handling of exceptions, etc. The Minister for Fisheries has flagged that the demersal species rules for West Coast are to be reviewed in 2012 and so should not change in this review.

Previously, comments had been collected from Fisheries Researchers on sustainability and from Fisheries Officers on compliance aspects. The purpose of the briefing was to get informal and initial reactions from Recfishwest. There were many questions and some very strong opinions expressed about some aspects of the balance and the amount of simplification achieved.

As with all proposals, the "devil can be in the detail", and this needs to be covered fully. Fisheries will now provide RFW with the full details so that RFW can prepare a considered formal response which could include requiring changes. Following that, the details will be publicised for public comment, managed and coordinated by Recfishwest. Following the public comment, the details will be adjusted if/as required by those comments and then passed to the Minister for approval for implementation.

By necessity, "standardisation" and "simplification" over four very different regions in a very large State could potentially result in winners and losers, either for the fish and/or for the fishermen. The challenges include keeping the end result simple, easily understood and supported by fishermen, yet ensuring sustainability which is in every fisherman's long term interests.

And no, I haven't included any details, because too many people get fixed on early possibilities and don't update themselves when the real proposals come out, and then too much time is wasted fixing up misunderstandings.

Positive report card for WA fisheries management.

A joint Department of Fisheries and Murdoch University study has shown fisheries management initiatives in Western Australia are achieving their intended results. Most importantly, the researchers found no evidence to suggest that fishing activity was having any major impact on the aquatic food chain within the State's four marine bioregions. Report http://www.fish.wa.gov.au/docs/frr/frr215/index.php?0401

The study found that, although species composition of catches has changed, there had been no detectable change in the food chains that underpin healthy ecosystems in the state's four bioregions. The research reveals that overall food chains are stable in each of those bioregions, which suggests that, at least at the bioregion level in WA, reports about 'fishing down the food web' are highly exaggerated.

The department responded to earlier concerns by bringing much of the recreational and commercial open access line fishing under more robust and formal management arrangements, aimed at reducing catches of demersal species by 50 per cent. Simulations undertaken in the research study found that stock numbers have increased as a result of this approach and should continue to rise over the next few years.

Conservationists continue to use media celebrities to repeat the misinformation that fisheries management doesn't work, and to mislead the uninformed public by saying that the <u>only</u> solution is to lock up large areas and percentages of the marine environment or risk the collapse of popular fish stocks.

As I drove over the dunes I couldn't believe the size of the swell. Maybe I should have left the rods at home and just brought the surfboard.

I persisted hard until well after high tide and hadn't had a nibble, maybe I should just keep driving north to Port Gregory or Horrocks. This is S Bend, I told myself, "The fish are where you find them", so I went to the park, picked up my key to the caravan and started driving the beaches to see if much of that weed had cleared. Most of it had except the swell was so big the reputable reefs were unfishable, which turned out to be fortunate for me as in the haste of packing at 3am I had left a box containing most of my poppers at home.

Fortunately that evening and all weekend the winds were slight and I got to another of my favourite spots south of Lucy's that actually hasn't been fishing too well for me in the last 12 months but the gutter as ever looked perfect. A guy from the park was there on a four-wheeler and in the prime location. This was a good sign as these locals know the area inside out and only bother fishing if they are guaranteed results. Pretty soon he had a mulloway of around 6 kilo flapping on the beach which was his dinner and he called it a night. Alright, my turn I thought and it started with first a dart, then a tailor quickly followed by five wobbegongs and a stingray to cap it off, so it wasn't to be for me. I was too tired to continue fishing so back to camp for a shower and bed.

The next morning I was joined by a mate by the name of Ringy who had recently moved to Geraldton from Victoria and had asked me to show him some spots. I took him back down to Wakies as it usually is my "go to spot" and as the sun rose not much happened and I was starting to make excuses. But by 8.30 the tailor and dart were running hot with it getting close to a fish a cast with some of the tailor pushing close to 2kg. We kept a couple for Ringy but threw bucket loads back, really enjoying a fantastic session of mainly catch and release.

I even managed to pull in a nice cobbler and finished off the session with an XOS eagle ray taking me for a long trip south. That evening we fished another spot which was a bit quiet except for the wobbegong coming on the bite later and a surprise threadfin salmon which I suspect was a long way from home.

The following morning we hit Wakies up again for some more tailor and dart. It was slower but we didn't care, catch and release was the call of the day and we enjoyed another good morning pretty much on our own private beach. Ringy had to head home so I spent that night scoping a few new spots and annoying the local wobbegong population or was it the other way around?

The final morning I was faced with the dilemma, being the tail end of the trip I was pretty tired and could do with a sleep in. I had looked at a spot the previous afternoon I have driven past a hundred times and I just knew I had to give it a go or I would be a tortured soul back in Perth wondering what could have been. So after a 'mini' sleep in I headed down and put in all the wet weather gear as I was likely and did get pretty wet.

My second cast ended with a snag and I was thinking negative thoughts and the weed was getting annoying, anyway so I chucked out again and was smashed by something big that didn't hook up. The following cast I got the hookup but this hard running fish ran me straight out to a bombie and buried me. A few casts later and I was on again but was able to turn the fish in what limited space I had and after a few powerful runs I got a big 'greenback' tailor onto the rocks.
