There were 20 delegates present at the April meeting of the above association held at the Marmion Club premises. George Holman was our delegate in attendance.

A lengthy discussion was held regarding the new bag limits on crabs and prawns and as the regulations were not clear to all delegates present, it was decided to have the regulations clarified so that further discussions may be had on a more concrete basis at the next meeting. The basis of the discussion was that some delegates were not happy with the lesser limits.

The association put forward a lengthy submission to the Minister favouring a new marina at Sorrento.

A very comprehensive and lengthy submission was forwarded to the National Parks against the closing of the area at the Warren River down near Pemberton, pointing out that closing down of access to National Parks areas seems to be the easiest solution rather than looking for more acceptable alternatives to benefit everyone.

The State Boat Championships are to be held on Saturday, 27th April 1985 hosted by the Marion Angling and Aquatic Club. For all further details a comprehensive competition brochure is available from the Marmion Club.
