REPORT ON JUNE A.A.A. MEETING: 13

A letter was received from Mr. Bowen of the Fisheries Department, asking the A.A.A.'s views on a proposal to institute a daily bag limit of five salmon. This move has originated from an advisory committee on fish management, which includes an A.A.A. member. The delegates were asked to refer to their Club's for their views on this bag limit.

A Notice of Motion was tabled by the Preston Angling Club to have White Spotted Shovel Nosed Rays excluded from A.A.A. competitions.

The W.A. Sporting Federation is being approached to assist with expenses for competitors at next year's Australian Championships. It seems that they might only offer a \$1 for \$1 subsidy of the top competitors in each team.

However, the A.A.A. itself is likely to be able to render some assistance.

Records passed were a) Corel Cod, weight 1.36 kgs caught at Steep Point on 2/1/78 by Ms. S. Holtham; b) Oriental Banto, weight 3.5 kg caught at Walpole by Mr. J.J. Orr.

The Open (Individual) Drycasting Competition is set for September 24th at Wordsworth Oval.

The teams event is set for August 27th.

The Facilities Committee of the A.A.A. reported that the reconstruction of North Beach Jetty had happened partly through their efforts. Also the committee is making moves to have the jetty at Jurien Bay refurbished.

The Denmark Rock and Beach Championship on the June L./E. were a great success, with 198 competitors. The Offshore Club practically scooped the pool, with Eddie Rossi being the overall Champion.

REQUEST FROM RECORDER:

Please take care with photos for fish records.

Photos must be:-

- 1) Close up - fill picture with fish.
- 2) Sharp in detail - Focus carefully (use tape).
- 3) Fish 'side on' and well lit.
- 4) Put tape or match box by the fish for comparison of scale.
- 5) Instant type shots not recommended, use slides on colour negatives for best result.
- 6) Get film developed as soon as possible after exposure for best result.
- 7) Use Kodak colour scale and include it in the picture alongside the fish and this will enable exact colour reproduction in colour prints.
- 8) Keep camera and film cool (78° degrees) heat will distort colour reproduction.
