OFF ROAD BILL:

An outline of the Bill and comments by Ken Jones.

The Act will be entitled:-

"The Off-Road Vehicles Act 1978".

It is described as:-

"An Act to regulate the use of vehicles in places other than roads, to provide areas where the use of certain vehicles shall be permitted, for the registration of certain vehicles, and for related purposes".

I would point out at this stage the Bill is to regulate vehicles off the road, not just unlicensed bikes and buggies but all vehicles.

Definitions:-

"Road" - means any highway, road or street, open to, or used by the public.

"Vehicle" means a vehicle that is propelled by an engine or other mechanical source of power.

Page 4, Section 5:

- (1) Subject to the Minister, it shall be the duty of a Council to administer and enforce the provisions of this Act within its district,

Page 4, Section 5:

- (3) For the purpose of this Act a district shall be taken to include the land lying between main high water mark at spring tides of the main sea, and mean low water mark at spring tides of the main sea adjacent to that district.

Use of Vehicles:-Page 4, Section 6:

- (1) A person shall not drive or use a vehicle otherwise than:-
 (a) on private land by consent; or
 (b) on land comprised within a permitted area unless permitted to do so pursuant to this Act.
 PENALTY, FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS.
- (3) The provisions of this section do not apply to, or in relation to the use on a road of a vehicle licensed under the Road Traffic Act 1974, or to the driving or use of such a vehicle on land adjacent to a road and set apart as a stopping place for vehicles using that road.

Licensing of Vehicles:-

All vehicles using the special areas mentioned in Section 6 (1)(b) will need be licensed and have mufflers. Vehicles used on private land, by consent are not covered by this Act.

Certain vehicles are exempted such as invalid chairs, Bona Fide Fishermen (professionals), miners, prospectors, firefighters, local authorities.

The onus is on the accused to prove he or she is one of the above. (All you have to do is take out a "miners right").

cont..

OFF ROAD BILL Cont'd:

The following section is most interesting and we may as a club, on our field days, apply for such grant.

Page 6, Section 8:

(3) The Minister may, in writing, grant to any person or body a permit authorising the driving or use of a vehicle in circumstances to which the provisions of sub section (1) of Section 6 of this Act would otherwise apply, either generally or subject to such restrictions, limitations or conditions as he may determine and as are specified therein, and may by subsequent notice, in writing, vary or cancel any such permit.

Page 7, Section 8:

(6) Refers to fees for such permits.

Owner Responsibility:Page 7, Section 10:

(1) Subject to the provisions of sub section (2) of this Section, the owner of any vehicle which is required to be registered under this Act, or which is a vehicle licensed under the Road Traffic Act 1974, and used otherwise than on a road or private land by consent, shall in all proceedings:

- (a) For an offence under the Act, or
- (b) In respect of damage, injury or death arising from the use of any such vehicle, be liable in respect of the probable consequences of the driving or use of that vehicle by a person under the age of 18 years and lawfully in possession of the vehicle as though he had formed a common intention and acted jointly with that other person.

Page 8, Section 11:

A person shall not knowingly permit any other persons under the age of 8 (eight) years to have charge of a vehicle, otherwise than on private land.

Penalty \$200.

The act then sets out details on declared areas for use by certain vehicles etc. These will be obtained by submissions from interested parties to a Committee.

Permanent Members of the Committee Section 18:

- (a) A person nominated by the Minister- Chairman
- (b) 5 other members: 2 selected from a panel of names submitted by the Local Gov. Assoc.
2 selected from a panel of names submitted by the Country Shire Councils Assoc.
1 selected by the Minister from persons who have experience in the operation of Off Road Vehicles.
- (c) and
Six ex officio members.
 - 1 from Dept of Conservation & Environment.
 - 1 from Soil Conservation Service Ag. Dept.
 - 1 from Town Planning Dept.
 - 1 from Forest Dept.
 - 1 from Local Govt Dept.
 - 1 from Public Service of the State.

I ask you, what chance has the Off Roader got in that lot????

OFF ROAD BILL Cont'd:

Some notes on policing the Act:-

Page 32, Section 35:

- (1) For the purposes of this act an authorised officer is:-
- (a) Any member of the Police Force
 - (b) Any person appointed as such pursuant to sub section (2) of this section within the area of jurisdiction entrusted to him by the appointment.
 - (c) Any person appointed as such pursuant to sub section (3) of this section within the area of jurisdiction entrusted to him by the appointment.
- (2) The Minister may appoint any person who is or acts in the office of
- (a) An Inspector the Environmental Protection Act
 - (b) A Forestry Officer
 - (c) A Wildlife Officer
 - (d) A Ranger (National Parks)
 - (e) A staff member of the Museum or an Honorary Warder under the Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972.
 - (f) An Inspector or Honorary Warder under the Waterways Conservation Act 1976.
 - (g) An Inspector under the Fisheries Act 1905
 - (h) A prescribed officer of a public authority
- (3) The council of a municipality may by resolution appoint any member or officer of that council to be an authorised officer for the purposes of this Act either in respect of the whole of the district of that municipality or any part thereof defined in the appointment

They will be under every stone!!!

Obstruction of an Officer

(6) Penalty \$200

I note that in all the sections ref offences the case is regarded as proven unless the defendant can show proof that he has a permit to be in a "off limit" area or that the land in question is private and with owners consent.

There is no innocent until proved guilty in this act.

The act will apply to the whole of the State, but the Minister has the power to declare areas exempt.

The second reading of the Bill was Tuesday 16th May. We have 30 days (that is to June 15) to lodge protests.

As I read the Bill you will not be able to take a vehicle off a road into the bush or anywhere except private land with the owners consent. As almost all the coastal land for one or two chains in from high water mark is crown land that will affectively cut us off from all the coast.

The only exceptions will be places where a road runs right to the water. Walking is not prohibited of course, only driving vehicles.

OFF ROAD BILL Cont'd:

I suggest you write immediately to your Member of Parliament setting out your views and also to the West Australian and the radio and t.v. stations. Any member who says "It will not worry me, they'll not police it" will be fooling himself.

In my view its a last ditch stand for anglers- we have not made enough noise in the past 2 years or so while all this was coming up- our representative body has barely raised a ripple over the issue and you can see from the make up of the Committee how much say we are going to get.

You had better sell your 4 W.D. now- they won't be worth a bumper when this Bill goes through! Buy a boat, our representative body is very active over boat ramps!
