FIELD DAY REPORT: PRESTON: 14/15TH FEBRUARY:

In the last few years a lot of reports have come from Preston and not many of them have been good, therefore, it was surprising to find such a large number signing on; 36 members, juniors and visitors. It was one of the few field days when all members in attendance were gathered at the sign on and weigh in together and if nothing else, it was going to be a very social weekend.

There seemed to be three main groups when the fishing commenced. The north mob consisted of about 5 vehicles which camped very close together and Bob Klein and Bill Utting who were about  $\frac{1}{2}$ -mile further North.

In the former party were G. Baskerville, D. Retallick, P. Isbister and another vehicle belonging to a visitor, all with their respective parties. (At this stage I would like to thank those members with transport facilities for taking those of us without 4 W.D. along the beaches.)

Heaviest scale fish went to Ric Parker with a giant tailor which would make great bait at Kalbarri next month; it went .65 of a kilo.

On the whole it was a very light hearted affair and though most members caught fish the prospect of going here again in the near future did not over excite the few members I spoke to.

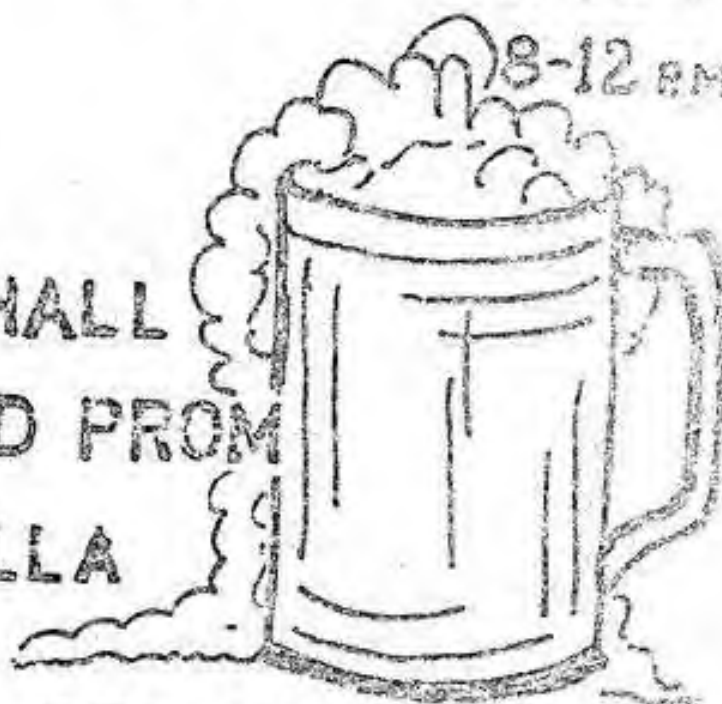
