OCTOBER DRYCASTING REPORT:

Drycasting? What a laugh!

Sunday was one of our wettest days for some years, yet a total of 21 casters turned up. As I have said before, the keenness this year is a delight to see. Because of the smaller numbers and the weather, we decided to have one group only.

The L.L. distance was run under reasonable conditions with a steady cross breeze and light rain. The conditions didn't greatly worry the distance Kings with Hewie and Ric Parker casting 135 and 139 metres respectively, and of course in third position Stan Renshaw consistently casting 125 metres. Our Junior girl, Joanne Tomsitt seemed to revel in the conditions- didn't incur any penalties and topped the Junior score for this event.

The D.H. accuracy saw some of our top scorers fall by the wayside. FIELD DAY RESOLUTION

Members, please note these Rules are for you to read. At the November General Meeting, they will be discussed and probably modified.

\*\*\*\*\*

On a field day, a member can only win one monetary award, but if he is successful in taking off, one or more awards he will be allocated points accordingly for the Sportsman of the Year Award. Committee meeting April 1963.

Any fish caught anytime, anywhere except on the field day venue, is eligible for entry in the Open Competition. General Meeting April 1964.

Not less than two committee men may be delegated by the F.D.O. to weigh in fish in extraordinary circumstances. Committee meeting May 1968.

On a field day any member may use any land vehicle available to him within the radius of the venue. General meeting August 1966.

Fish caught between commencing time and weigh in time on a field day venue are eligible for field day competitions only. Fish caught outside these times are eligible for the open section only. General meeting December 1964.

Members entering fish in the open competition shall qualify entries by attending at least 3 club meetings, field days or casting venues. Members who through employment obligations reside/or/and work in country areas be exempted. The club to provide an attendance book to be signed at each meeting for this purpose. General meeting August 1965.

In all fishing competitions a fish will have to exceed the weight of fish which is leading in its class unless caught on the same day. All rigs to be removed from fish before weighing in. Committee meeting May 1966.

A member must cast the bait, hook the fish and play the fish to gaffing unaided. Committee meeting May 1966.

Ten pound minimum weight on sharks in the field day competition. Committee Meeting 1967.

Field day organiser to keep details of heavy fish caught on field days to assist in the selection of the most meritorious capture. Committee meeting April 1968.

The sequence of future field day competitions should read as follows:

- A. Heaviest Scale Fish
- B. Heaviest Shark
- C. Heaviest Bag of Scale Fish

General meeting January 1969.

Buff Bream be accepted as scale fish at all times.

General Meeting May 1965

Committee Meeting August 1969

As from commencement of 1970-71 fishing competition, the club will not accept fish caught on the field day of another fishing club, entered in our Open competition.  
Committee Meeting 1970

A landing net with a two foot handle be approved.  
Committee Meeting April 1970

On a field day a bag limit of five salmon be caught on a double handed rod and five salmon on a single handed rod shall be entered for competition.  
Salmon in excess of this are not eligible for competition.  
Committee Meeting August 1970

All field days to have a compulsory check on before the field day starts at a time designated by the F.D.O.  
Committee meeting July 1971.

If an angler deems it necessary, to use two rods in order to cast a single bait off the beach, this be accepted as an orthodox method of angling.  
Committee Meeting September 1971

Should a bag of fish containing an undersized fish be presented at the weigh in, that bag shall be rejected in total.  
Committee meeting September 1971.

Field days may be cancelled due to rough weather or otherwise at the discretion of the F.D.O. In the event of a cancellation the field day will be held at the same, or alternative venue at the F.D.O. discretion, one week later. In the event of a second cancellation of the scheduled venue, the field day for that month will be cancelled. General meeting September 1971.

All members to check in on field day venues personally, with the exception of any member unable to get there in time who may ring the F.D.O. Committee meeting Oct. 1971.

The F.D.O. will allow at least 2 hours from the cessation of fishing to the end of the weigh in time. Committee meeting April 1972. General Meeting May 1972.

If the four sections (in the field day sweep) go off including the heaviest bag of fish, then the sweep money be divided equally. Committee Meeting April 1972.

The maximum of twelve pound line be reduced to nine pound line on the field day and open single handed competition. General meeting May 1972.

All 3 to 1 badges and game fish badges be presented at the first general meeting after verification. Committee meeting June 1972.

Club retain present scoring system and does not record the number of fish caught by individual members. Committee meeting December 1972.

All whaler sharks to be entered in the fishing competitions as whaler sharks (without attempting subdivision into further classification). Committee Meeting March 1973.

In the event of a tie for the various sections, the sweep money will be divided equally, commencing with the August 1973 field day. Committee meeting August 1973.

Any of the following fish, with a minimum weight of ten pounds, may be entered for game fish badges.

All sharks other than gummies to have a minimum weight of 5 kgs. General meeting September 1974.

Line testing to be carried out using suitable weights and Government tested scales, with the Recorder acting as certifying officer. Committee meeting April 1975.

Resolved that the monthly points for Section 1 fishing competition be rounded to the nearest point and that the points be accumulated for the 12 months to ascertain the winner. Committee meeting August 1975.

Review of competition sections.  
Section 8 (Open) to be in line with field day section.  
Section 15 (Open) removal of word "scale".  
Section 4 (Field Day) minimum weight to be 1kg.  
All other conditions remain unaltered.  
Committee meeting April 1976.

Sportsman of the year points to be awarded as follows:  
2 points for field day awards  
2 points for each field day section change.  
Committee meeting April 1976.

Open Section.  
That the word Spanish Mackerel be removed from open section henceforth.  
General meeting August 9th, 1978.

2 to 1, 3 to 1, 4 to 1 and 5 to 1 badge rules.

1. Standard fishing gear consisting of rod, reel and line.
2. Level line to be used, leader not to exceed 15 feet, nylon or wire and poundage.
3. First 15 feet of unused line to be supplied with application of capture. Three tests to be made on registered testing machine and the average to be taken as the breaking strain of line.
4. Fish classification to be as standard club rules.  
Wobbies, carpet sharks, Port Jackson, fiddle sharks and all species of rays are ineligible.  
Sharks as recognised in field day and open section be eligible.
5. Fish to be weighed on Government tested scales and name and address of owner of scales to be stated.
6. All applications must be accompanied by photograph.
7. Dimensions of fish, weight, length and girth to be stated.
8. Place and date of capture to be stated.
9. Declarations of witness to capture and weighing to be by a person not less than 17 years of age.
10. Fish to be hooked, played and landed from shore, jetty, groyne or wharf. Fish must be brought to gaff by the applicant without assistance.

11. Applications to be in the hands of the Club Recorder within 30 days.
12. There be 2-1; 4-1 and 5-1 line ratio badges and that Sportsman of the Year points be allocated in proportion to those allocated for the 3-1 line ratio. That is, 2-1 - 2 points; 4-1 - 4 points and 5-1 - 5 points. Such points to apply only on field days.
13. If as a result of line testing, the entry fails to qualify for the particular badge nominated, then the entry will automatically be considered for any appropriate line ratio for which the necessary conditions are fulfilled.
14. Any fish entered will be eligible for one line ratio badge only.
