KALBARRI COTTAGE...

As has been mentioned in the past the Committee has been having a thorough look at all aspects of our investment in our club cottage at Kalbarri.

Our new club Vice-President, Derry Barber, through his company Data-Plan has done a complete computer analysis of three options open to the club- 1. Selling the property and investment the money, 2. putting in a full time tenant; 3. letting our unit out to club members and the public. The most beneficial option was the first one, giving a return in excess of 14 per cent. Derry also pointed out that by purchasing the property at the price we paid for it and at that time, and taking into account what the property is worth now, we have enjoyed a return of 15 per cent per annum over the 15 years we have owned our cottage... a very good investment.

However, committee has decided to recommend we accept an offer from Kalbarri Accommodation to handle all bookings at the best price they can look at with the proviso that club members get a \$50 reduction on their booking. We had only two bookings by club members last year and it is felt that we must not let our cottage become a losing concern.

A list of current financial members will be sent to our agent so that concessions will only go to bona-fidi club members!!

This arrangement should give us a return of 10-11 per cent approximately.

We need a full attendance of members so that all may contribute to discussing ideas put forward by those present and then laying the foundations to a smooth-run event.

Allocation of jobs and methods proposed to run the event will also be organised, so there won't be any last minute problems.

Saturday afternoon all of us went to West End to fish, with Tony, Philomena, Ian Taggart and myself fishing Wilsons and Heather Osborne and her crowd trying the tennis courts. At two in the afternoon the tailor were already there at Wilsons and they stayed until a shark chased them out and then bit me off. Meanwhile Heather had sneaked a peek at us fishing and realising that what we were cleaning was tailor was soon back with the rest of the mob. Tony said to clean our fish then try again as he believed that the tailor would soon be back. Sure enough they were and they stayed long enough for everyone to get a few, Nick, Linda and Glen thoroughly enjoyed themselves having never experienced a tailor run before. 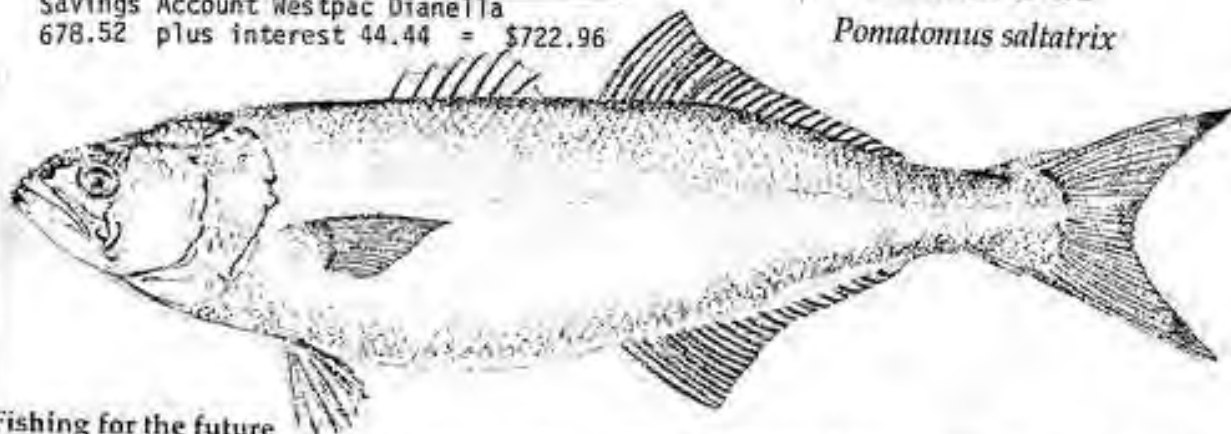

Fishing for the future

The popularity of tailor fishing as a pastime has led to worldwide fluctuations and declines in catches.

Reduced catches throughout Australia and irregularity of seasonal migrations have prompted anglers and their representatives to call for tighter management and full-scale research.

In Western Australia survey figures from 1987 indicate around 86 000 people go fishing for tailor each year. Researchers estimate that over 70 per cent of this fishing occurs between Bunbury and Jurien Bay.

To conserve tailor breeding stocks the State Government has imposed a daily bag limit of 20 on tailor in all

areas. Anglers can help to protect their own fishing futures by observing this limit at all times. Who needs more than 20 tailor each day?

There is still a great deal to be learnt about our tailor from a research point of view - including basic knowledge such as the extent of the amateur catch in WA waters.

Fisheries scientists at the Waterman Marine Laboratories intend to give the species high priority in the future. Properly managed tailor tagging programmes and computer modelling will have major roles.
